
Film: Open Your Eyes, a journey from darkness to sight

Exploring White Privilege

As part of the Consultation on Church Union, the Presbyterian Church (USA) has pledged to "...Combat systematic white privilege as a hallmark of Churches uniting in Christ." In this series of classes, we will explore the history, causes, values, consequences, and possible remedies to the problem of systematic white privilege in the United States. Each of the classes will approach the issue from a particular perspective, including those of Native American displacement, Chinese exclusion and migration, and white ignorance.

The Privilege of Ignorance – Sunday, October 23 / Ben Daniel

"Because White Americans have privilege of remaining ignorant about atrocities of the past and injustice in the present, this session will explore how ignorance is a manifestation of privilege.

The Doctrine of Discovery – Sunday, October 30 / David Siegenthaler

How did a royal proclamation about indigenous title turn into a doctrine of discovery that, bolstered by a Supreme Court decision, helped to legitimize taking land from Native Americans? What is the legacy of this attitude and its legal expressions with which we must contend today? What more can be done to address the remaining inequities and the root causes that are consequences and perpetuators of white privilege?

Chinese Exclusion and Migration – Sunday, November 6 / Rod Chan

This session will include the culturally forgotten Chinese Exclusion laws and the effects on Rod's family history, an expanded background regarding our common history and heritage back to plus or minus 70,000 years, and a thought experiment regarding the default position that humans tend to take in our power relationships with each other.

We shall discuss this fascinating production of fact and fantasy, its message of resistance and hope, and its great influence on Western politics, art, music, cinema, and culture.

Dr. Jack Elliott is Professor Emeritus of Theology and Religious Studies at the University of San Francisco. He has written twelve books and stresses the historical, economic, social and political contexts of religion. He has taught at MPC before.
