The world of the Bible is a man's world. The women we meet there are constrained in their choices, and their power and identities are determined in relation to the men in their lives. Often we don't even learn their names. They are mothers, daughters, sisters, and wives. They reside in cities, towns, villages, and palaces, but are largely relegated to the private sphere of hearth and home.

Yet the women of the Bible frequently find it within themselves to navigate the strictures of patriarchy in order to enact a better way. With the guidance of Rev. Dr. Carol Miles, we will see how they defy social conventions, speak truth to power, exercise civil disobedience, and act on their divinely given instincts to bring the justice, compassion, and redemption of God into the world. How might their lives inspire us?

Rev. Dr. Carol Antablin Miles has an abiding interest in feminist theology and women's spirituality. She has led numerous retreats and bible study groups for women. A self-described scholar-mom, she regularly uses the ordinary and extraordinary experiences of women as a source of theological reflection. Her publications include "And Your Daughters Shall Prophesy: Preaching as Women's Work" and "An Ambidextrous Sense of Call: Reframing the Questions of Work and Family."



Carol is a graduate of U.C. Berkeley and Princeton Seminary, where she earned both M.Div. and Ph.D. degrees. Her ministry of theological education led her first to Austin Seminary in Austin, Texas, where she served as Assistant Professor of Homiletics from 1999-2005, and subsequently to Luther Seminary in Saint Paul, Minnesota, where she was Associate Professor of Biblical Preaching from 2005-2008.

In 2008, Carol was called to be the Presbyterian Campus Pastor and Executive Director of Westminster House, a ministry of the San Francisco Presbytery at U.C. Berkeley. After Westminster House closed in 2011, she has been a Visiting Professor at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, which is a member school of the Graduate Theological Union. She also teaches in our own Adult Ed program.

Carol currently resides in Orinda and enjoys (among other things) strong coffee, well-told stories, and friendships new and old. She remains a lifelong fan of her two sons, Ethan (21) and Sam (19), both away at college.
